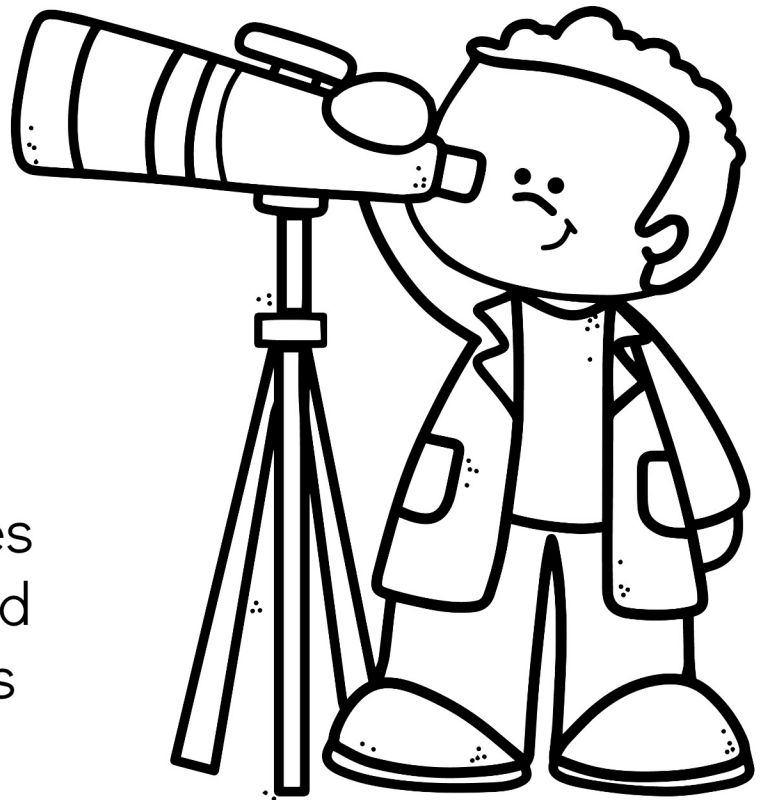
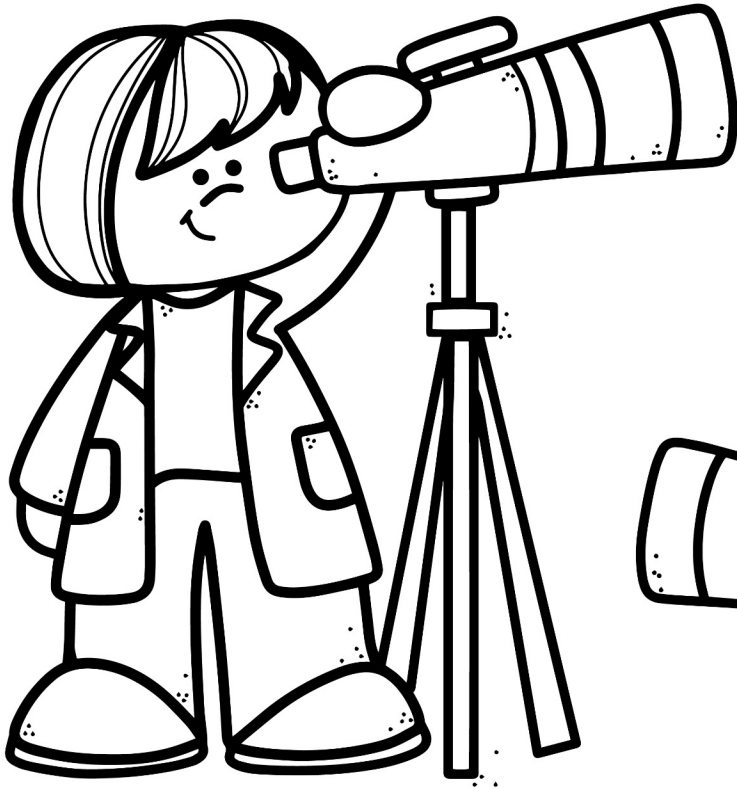


A person who studies human history and prehistory through the excavation of sites and the analysis of artifacts and other physical remains.

# botanist

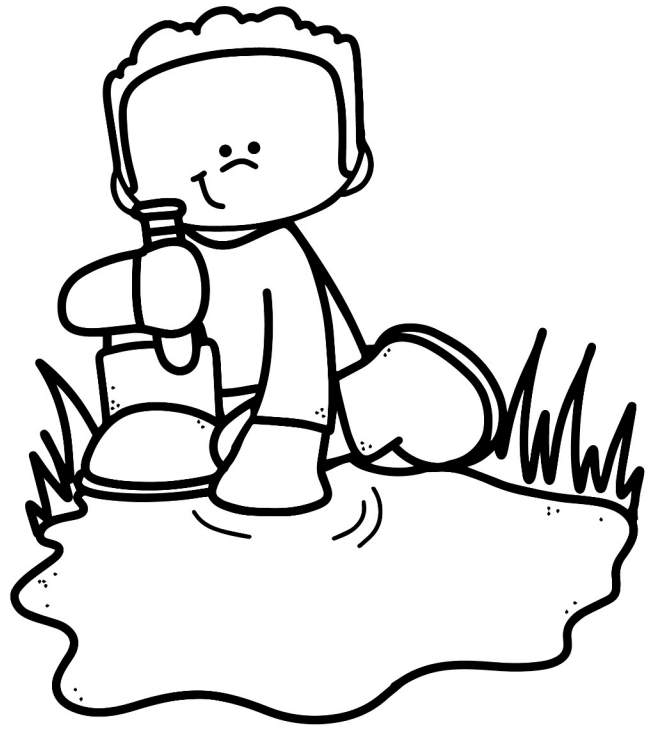
An expert in or student of

A person who studies the natural relationships between the air, land, water, animals, plants, etc.

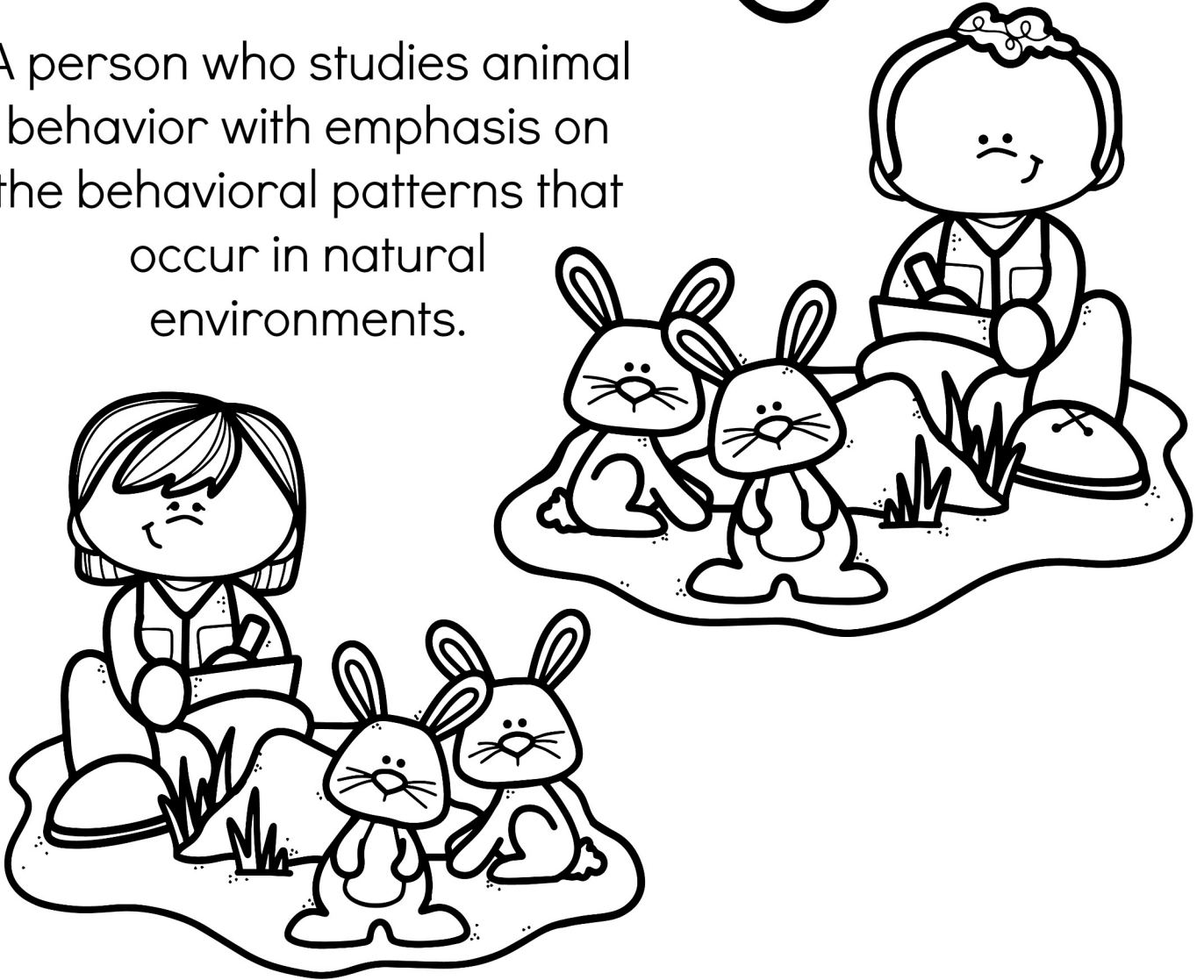

# geneticist

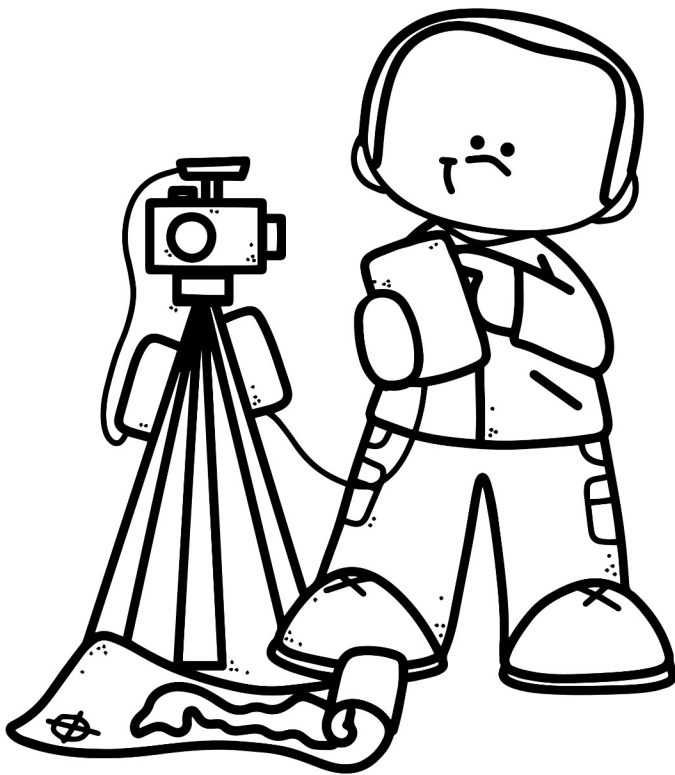


A scientist who studies genes, including how they are inherited, mutated, activated, or inactivated.

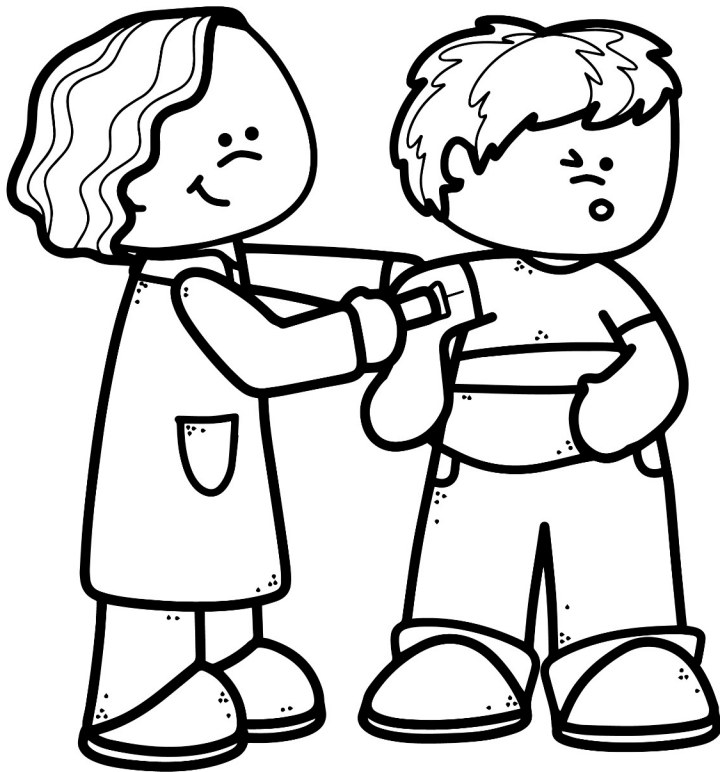
A person who studies reptiles  
and amphibians.



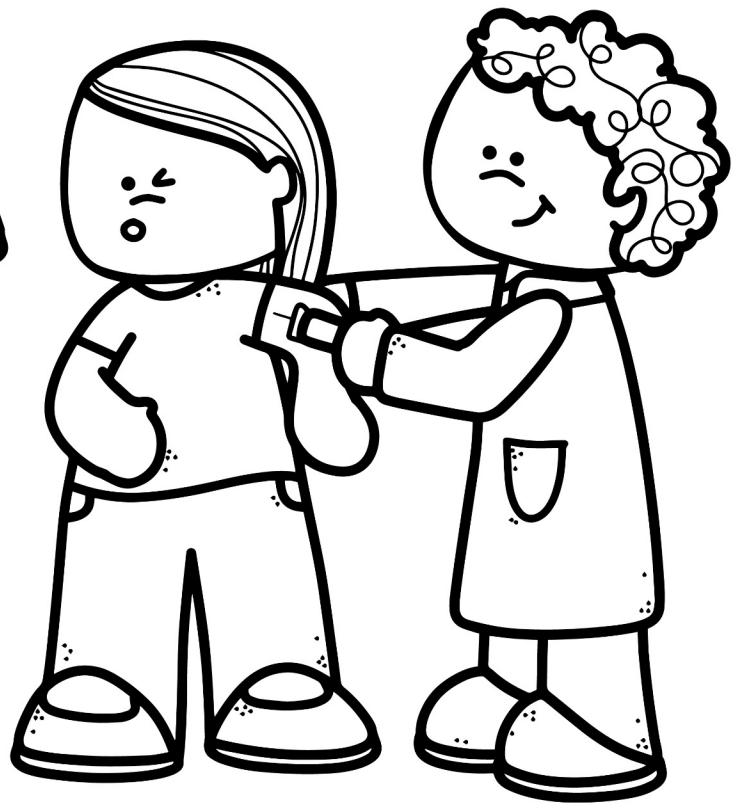

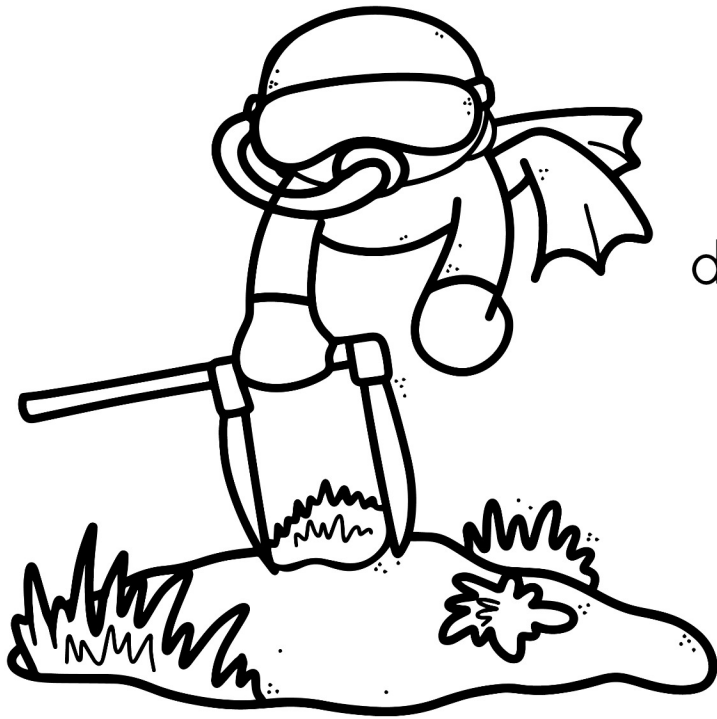


A person who studies immune responses associated with disease.

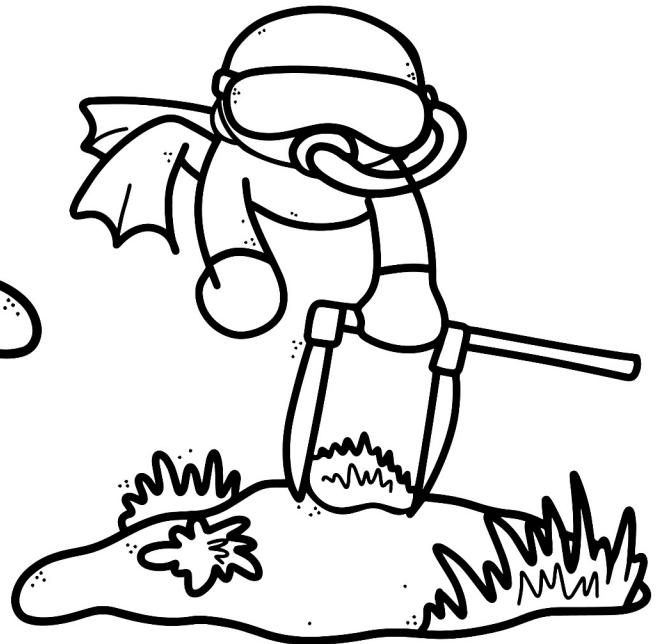

# marine biologist



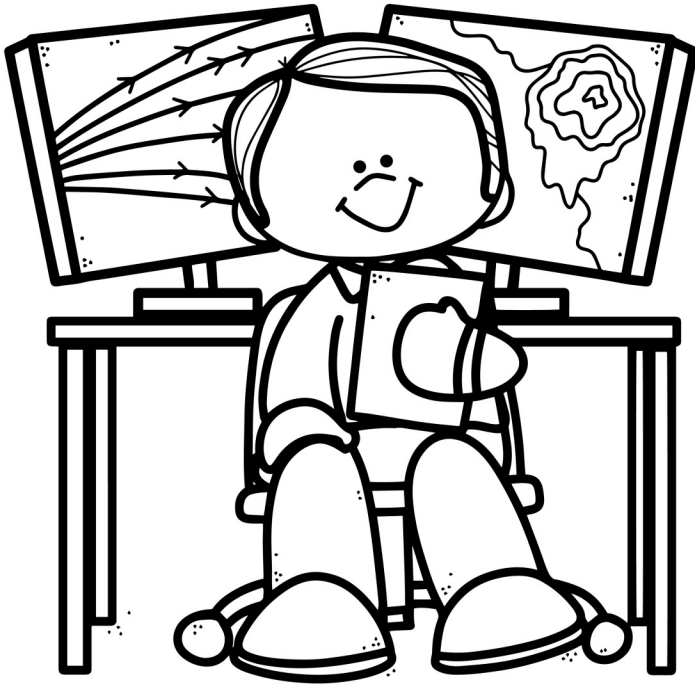
A person who studies organisms living in or dependent on the oceans.

# meteorologist



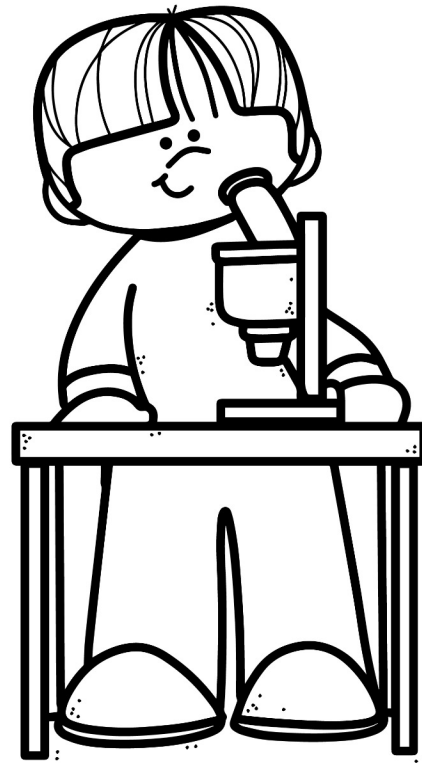
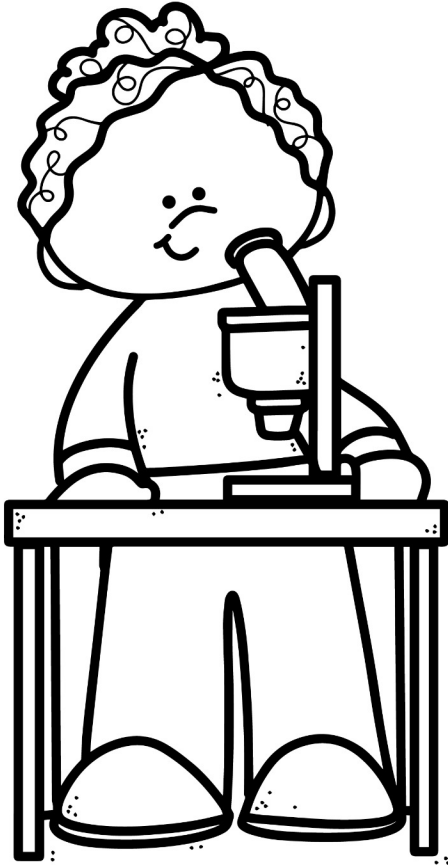
A person who studies the atmosphere and its phenomena, including weather and climate.

# microbiologist

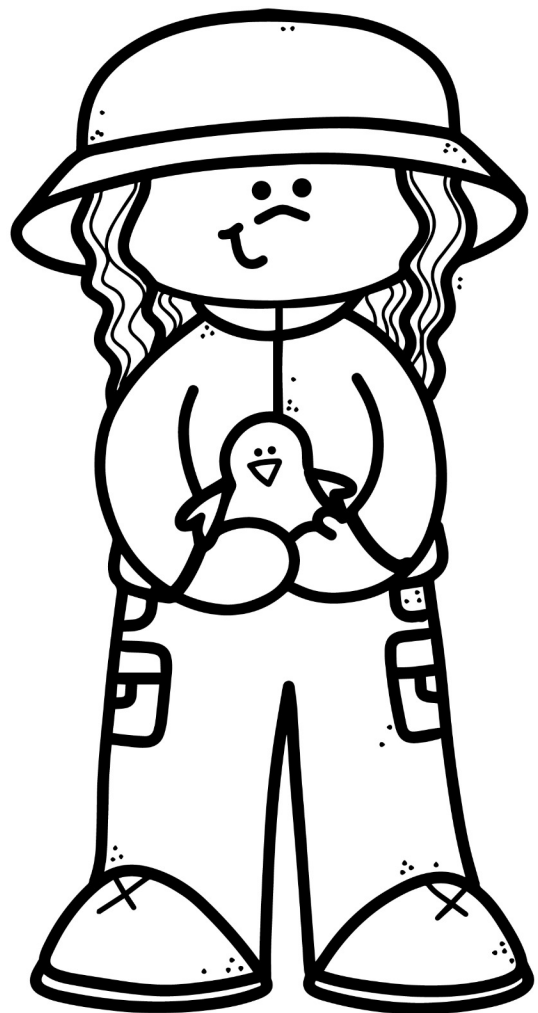
A person who studies microorganisms such as bacteria, viruses, algae, fungi, and some types of parasites. They try to understand how these organisms live, grow, and interact with their environments.
